

# How long can you temporarily deactivate a Facebook account? [[ 24 to 365 days ]]

A Facebook account can be temporarily deactivated for an unlimited amount of time, as there is no maximum time limit set by Meta. It's important to note that **deactivation is different from deletion**. Deactivation is temporary and reversible, while deletion permanently removes your account after a grace period.
